



Fumigation period means the exposure period plus degas or aeration period. When the exposure period is ended the treated commodity should be left aerated for a certain time. Then the concentration inside the commodity will be detected to ensure that the fumigant left is not harmful to any person. If so, the fumigation period is over.

SOME FUMIGATION DO'S

1. Do inform employees and family that may try and enter about the process
2. Do lock & safeguard the area from being interfered with
3. Do safeguard and observe the warning signs installed
4. Do give the operators your contact number
5. Do keep handy the telephone number of the supervisor
6. Do not worry about food, fruits and vegetables
7. Do not keep cupboard doors closed
8. Do not give keys to anyone but the technician dismantling the area
9. Do not worry about explosions the gas is not combustible
10. Do not worry about toxic residues left behind. The gas is not a residual gas.
11. Do not worry about after-ventilation-treatment fumes
12. Do not worry about odours on beds and surfaces
13. Some odours may linger only after the fogging protective process, washing of exposed fabrics may be necessary

AND DON'TS

1. Do not leave animal furs/rugs in the area to be fumigated
2. Do not leave computers running
3. Do not leave ice-making refrigerators turned on (if not isolated)
4. Do not leave pets of any kind inside the fumigation area
5. Do not leave transistor radios on
6. Do not leave air conditioners or ventilation vents on or open
7. Do not leave smoke alarms on
8. Do not attempt to remain in areas while fumigant is being released
9. Do not attempt to re-enter the area until it is declared safe to do so
10. Do not leave plastic covers on mattresses
